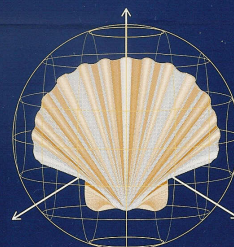

## Objective

This Conference is part of, and supported by, the Human Capital and Mobility Programme "Shells: Mathematical Modelling and Analysis, Scientific Computing" of the Commission of the European Communities (Contract no ERBCHRXCT 940536) in which nine European laboratories and universities are involved. As such it will bring together different research groups in this domain, and it will give them the opportunity to interchange their knowledge and results of the current state of the art of topics like asymptotic analysis, modelling, control, and numerical simulation of shells and other "thin" elastic structures such as plates and rods, and their applications in structural engineering.

## Format

About thirty-five lectures of 45 minutes, mostly by invitation. Owing to the nature of the congress, attendance is limited 80 participants. Speakers will be requested to provide a 4-page abstract, in the style of a "Note aux Comptes-Rendus de l'Académie des Sciences". Abstracts will be published and distributed at the beginning of the Conference.

## Registration

Participants are requested to fill in the Registration Form and return it to the Organizing Committee as soon as possible and no later than 30th April 1997. Accommodation can be reserved for participants and accompanying family members in the University Residence "Monte de la Condesa", with pleasant views over the city. The Conference will be held at the School of Optics of Santiago University, situated in the same building as the Residence.

## Grants

The Organizing Committee allows for a number of grants (about 25,000 ptas each) destined to young researchers and postgraduate students who wish to attend the Conference. All applications have to include proof of eligibility and must be sent along with the Registration form. The Organizing Committee will communicate their decision to all candidates before 15th June 1997 and will refund the agreed amount during the Conference.

## Venue

A World Heritage City, Santiago de Compostela is pleasantly situated near the confluence of the Sar and Sarela rivers. The discovery of the relics of the apostle St. James the Great in AD 813 made the town grow up around the tomb. As a result of this Santiago became the most important Christian place of pilgrimage after Jerusalem and Rome during the Middle Ages.

Santiago ranks among the finest cities in Spain: a stroll around the old town and the magnificent cathedral would suffice to convince anyone of that. Its university has made Santiago a seat of knowledge centuries old, and its present status as capital of the autonomous region of Galicia bodes well for its future.

Santiago is easy to reach by airplane from all major international airports and is also within daily travelling distance from the picturesque Costa de la Muerte (Coast of Death), Finisterre (Spanish Land's End) and the cities of La Coruña, Lugo, Orense and Pontevedra.

Due to the effect of the Atlantic winds, a little bit of rain may be expected at any season. Nonetheless July is usually a dry sunny month with temperatures in the range of 25-30 °C during the day. A light jumper or cardigan might be useful at nights.

A tour to the coast and a conference dinner have been planned.
